Packing LIST

Any luggage, bag, trunk, storage tub, organizer is acceptable. Please note that space is limited and cabins are shared with up to 13 other campers and counselors.

- Camp Clothes- Modest clothing suitable for physical activity no short shorts or mini skirts.
 Modest bathing suits only no bikinis (tankinis are okay as long as the top overlaps the bottom).
- **Dress Clothes** While not required, campers enjoy dressing up on Friday night for the "Ranchademy Awards," the Friday night banquet, and testimony service. This is typically a dress shirt and slacks for guys, and a skirt or dress (with at least 2-finger-width straps) for girls.
- Theme Clothes- See More Stuff to Know on the back page.
- Jacket/Rain Jacket- for cool nights and rainy days.
- Bedding- All campers need a pillow, sheets and blanket, or sleeping bag for a twin bed.
- **Sleeping bag or hammock** Senior Campers will need this for their camp out night. We have hammocks available for purchase (\$32) in the canteen.
- Towels and washcloths
- Personal hygiene items
- Sunscreen and insect repellent
- Closed-toe/tennis shoes- bring multiple pairs in case it rains!
- Creek shoes or sandals with back-straps
- Flashlight
- Peanut-free snacks and bottled water to keep in the cabin.
- **Prescription medications** all meds must be turned in to the camp nurse at check-in. *Meds must be in their original packaging.*
- Bible, notebook, and pen.

Special Activity ITEMS

These items are only necessary if your camper is signed up to participate in specific activity classes, or may wish to participate in one during free time. See the Activity Classes section for more information.

- · Horseback Riding- Jeans or pants and covered shoes
- Ropes/Challenge Course activities- Long shorts and tennis shoes required. Sandals of any kind (including Chacos) are not allowed.
- · Laser/Archery Tag- Clothes that can get dirty

Don't Bring (OR SEND) THIS STUFF!

Cell phones, all electronic devices (ipods, mp3 players, video games, etc), ipads or tablets, pets, cash, tobacco in any form, alcoholic beverages, drugs (including non-prescription), snacks with peanuts, gum, lighters, matches, weapons, fireworks, radios, magazines, rollerblades, skateboards, hoverboards/self-balancing scooters, drones, or sexually explicit literature or items. **Also, do not bring pets during Sunday** *check-in or the Saturday finale!*

GETTING TO FLINT VALLEY **By GPS:** Search for New Life Ranch Flint Valley or 160 New Life Ranch Dr., Colcord, OK 74338

FROM TULSA: Take I-44 or I-244 east out of Tulsa. These interstates merge with Hwy 412. Continue on Hwy 412 east all the way or get on the Cherokee Turnpike (\$3 Toll). There is a small blue "New Life Ranch" sign about 500 ft before the left turn onto S 700 County Road, just past the Cenex gas station. Continue for 3 miles until you reach the bottom of the valley and NLR - Flint Valley will be on your left. FROM NORTHWEST ARKANSAS: NLR - Flint Valley is located 32 miles west of Springdale just north of Hwy 412. Take Hwy 412 west from Springdale or from Hwy 49 to Siloam Springs, AR. NLR - Flint Valley is 5 miles west of Siloam Springs. There is a small blue "New Life Ranch" sign about 500 ft before the turn. Turn right on S 700 County Road and continue for 3 miles until you reach the bottom of the valley and NLR - Flint Valley will be on your left.
